

Dr. Elad Gil is a Mishael Cheshin Post-Doctoral Fellow at the the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, Faculty of Law. He is also a fellow at the Abba Eban Institute for international Diplomacy at the Interdisciplinary Center Herzliya (IDC) and the Executive Editor of *The Arena: Diplomacy and Foreign Relations Quarterly* at the School of Government, IDC. Elad scholarship's focuses on foreign relations and national security law, and more broadly on public law, constitutional design, and separation of powers theory. His work, which integrates doctrinal, institutional, and comparative methodologies, has been published or is forthcoming in the *Harvard National Security Journal*, *Tulane Law Review*, the *Harvard Law School Forum on Corporate Governance and Financial Regulation*, and by Springer Press, among others.

Elad Received his Doctorate degree (S.J.D.) from Duke Law School, an L.L.B in Law and M.B.A in Business Administration from the Hebrew University and an L.L.M in International legal studies as a Fulbright scholar from American University School of Law. Before joining Duke, Elad was a researcher at the Israel Democracy Institute and a member of the International Task Force on Terrorism, Democracy, and the Law with the Woodrow Wilson Center and the Max Planck Institute.
